Appendix 1: Countries that have used Codentify

Several sources associated with the distribution of Codentify claim that Codentify, in some variant, has been used in over 50 to 100 countries worldwide. ¹⁻³ As these industry-linked sources do not detail the countries, these claims cannot be verified. Below is a list of countries which other named sources (identified below) suggest have implemented Codentify in some form. ⁴⁻⁶ We note, however, that this may simply signal the industry's internal use of Codentify as a product authentification tool rather than for track and tracing purposes and that equally, it may not signal government support for Codentify (see, for example ⁷)
